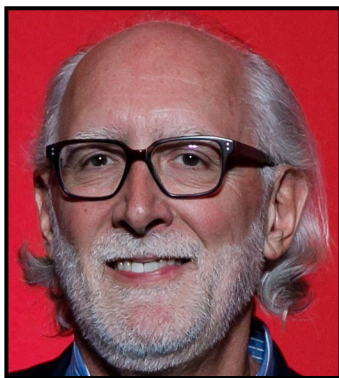

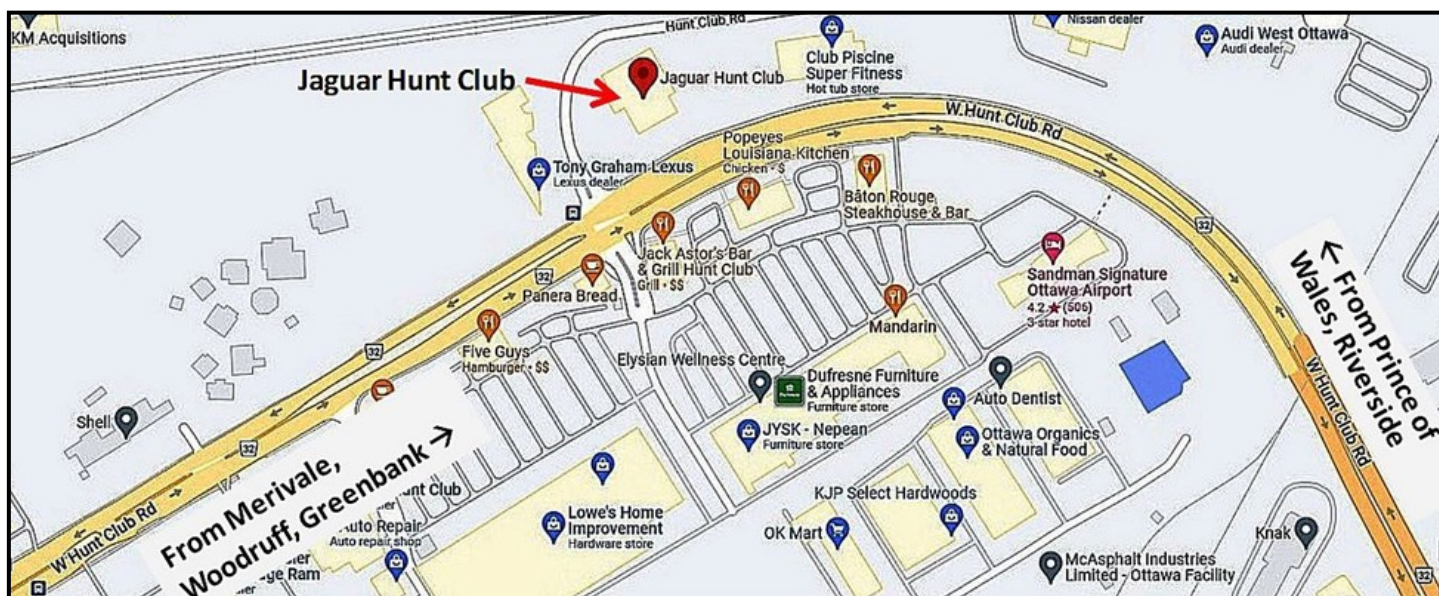


Ottawa Jaguar Club - Jaguar Hunt Club Show and Shine/Facility Tour - June 22nd

As Mike's project nears completion we are all anxious to see the finished product, it promises to be a stunning looking vehicle!

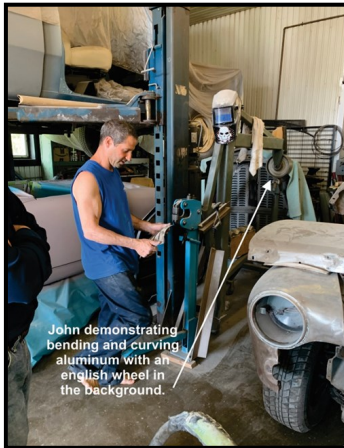

A Technical Visit By The Ottawa Jaguar Club - 21 May 2022

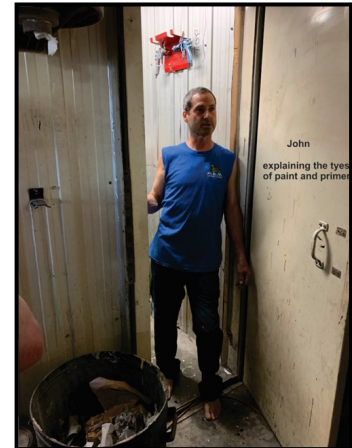
John Blouin has been in business on the North End of Malakoff Road (South of Richmond) for the past 24 years. His business is only restoration. No insurance work. Most projects that were in the shop had been taken to bare metal and primed awaiting parts or completion. John is very helpful and is prepared to visit anyone who is doing a Jaguar Project to answer questions and offer advice. He will not be offering new projects until 2023 as his work is very well known and his shop is full. The images that follow are but a sample of what he presented over the hour or so that we were there. We gathered somewhere around the junction of Malakoff Rd and Century Road West. We then proceeded south to John's shop at 6208 Malakoff Rd, for the shortest drive in Club History. The photos have details on them to explain what we saw.



John is very experienced in sheet metal work and has the ability to design and build all sorts of panels, as required.



To demonstrate his experience, here is a sleigh that he built on the chassis of a snow mobile.



John can paint in many types of paints, cellulose, and single stage or two stage such as base clear. He uses only the best products and as a result the material is expensive.

Looking Back—Reflections—the OJC Concours

Next June 19th, the Ottawa Jaguar Club will hold its fifteenth annual Concours. We thought it might be time to look back over the past few years, perhaps renew some memories, and see how things have changed - or haven't.

Paddy and I have been involved with Concours activities for only twelve of those years, so that is as far back as we can take you, but it is an interesting period.

The first concours we will visit is 6 June 1992. I was president and **Ernie Bayliss** was concours chair. In these early years our meet and greets were in a hotel room at the Baron's Motel in Bells Corners, and the concours itself was in Andrew Hayden Park overlooking the Ottawa River. We had only a dozen people at the meet and greet, which was typical of the time.

The morning of the concours it rained and by 1100 I thought we were going to have to scrub the

event. We convened a meeting with chief judge **Trevor Klotz** and just as we were about to shut things down, it suddenly cleared up. We instructed judges to ignore water spots, and carried on with a successful concours. Once the judging was finished, we all went home to change for a formal dinner at Baron's Motel where the awards were made. This was quite a lavish function with fifty people attending.

In 1993 we were back at Baron's Motel and Andrew Hayden Park. This time the weather started clear on the morning of 5 June, and it didn't start to rain until the judging was just finished. That was a relief, as the High Commissioner from Belize was there to represent the Jaguar Preserve. We changed for our formal dinner and awards ceremony at Baron's. **Gary Magwood**, a famous race car driver, was our guest speaker and shared some

interesting stories about his career.

The following year, on 11 June 1994, we had one of the largest turn-outs to date, about sixty cars. We also had a well-attended meet and greet at Baron's, and the next day the weather was perfect at Andrew Hayden Park. At the formal dinner and awards **John Arnone** from Jaguar Canada made the presentations.

The 1995 concours was held on 10 June. Again we had only a dozen people show up at the meet and greet. On the day of the concours we had excellent weather for the second year in a row, followed by the usual awards banquet and dinner at Baron's.

The **Roberts** and **Robertsons** were co-concours chairs, and we found that after the end of a long hot day, many people weren't anxious to go home, change, and come back for another several hours. This was the last year we had a formal concours awards dinner.

The 8th of June 1996 began with a cold rain, but fortunately it cleared up by noon. We had the awards immediately after the judging results were available, and then had a picnic dinner catered by Lone Star Catering on site in Andrew Hayden Park.

The next year was a concours of firsts and lasts. This was our last at Andrew Hayden Park, and the first that we were privileged to have **Barbara Woods** arrange our meet and greet. On the 7th of June, we had fifty two cars register for the concours, which was

one of our best years. **Michael Bell**, the new owner of Jaguar Ottawa, brought along an XK8, and this was the first time many of us had a chance to see (and test drive) this new beauty. This was also the first year that British High Commissioner **Sir Anthony**

and **Lady Goodenough** came to make the 'drop dead gorgeous' award. Lone Star served a meal on site again.

For the 1998 concours we moved to the Aviation Museum. It poured rain in the morning and we had fewer than forty cars register, which was hardly surprising. It was a good thing that **Michael Bell** had set up a large marquis tent for us. **Sir Anthony Goodenough** presented the awards, by which time there were some welcome sunny breaks. We finished the day with a dinner on site, once again catered by Lone Star.

The following year, 1999, we had a special concours. This was the launch of the new Jaguar S-Type, and **Michael Bell** asked if we would hold the concours in a concurrent ceremony with the official launch. The concours was held in the Aberdeen Pavilion, and moved to Sunday, 6 June. It was quite a show. A jazz band was on hand,

with pipers and colour party, and later the band of the Governor General's Foot Guards. **Sir Anthony** and **Lady Goodenough** again presented the awards.

The 2000 concours was our first on the grounds of the Museum of Science and Technology, with a meet and greet at the Chimo Inn organized by **Barbara**. Unfortunately, Saturday 10 June dawned cold and overcast - a worry for concours chair **Bob Hiland**. The feature marque was the XJ-S - 20

years of production. We had quite a line-up. Fortunately, we weren't rained out, and after the awards we had cold cuts and salads under a tent set up for us by the museum.

By this time we had seen enough rain, and decided to move the

We certainly got our wish on 16 June 2001. After a spectacular

meet and greet organized by **Barbara** at Capone's we had a perfect day for the concours at the Museum. It was hot and sunny most of the morning and afternoon. Just as the awards began we had a windstorm and downpour that brought everything to a screeching halt. Fifty people were suddenly crammed under two small tents exchanging pleasantries with **Sir and Lady Goodenough**. When the rain let up a bit we headed off for dinner at Capone's. This was the last year we were to see the Goode-noughs.

In 2002, the meet and greet at Capone's was organized by **Barbara Woods** and **Guy Larabie**, and we had a big crowd. Fifty-three people participated. The next morning on the 15th we woke up to a torrential downpour. Under

any other circumstances this would have washed out the concours completely, no questions asked. But the Museum came to concours chair **Frank Basten's** rescue. They invited us to move our concours inside the museum, mixed in with the rest of the exhibits. The new British High Commissioner participated. It was still pouring when we went to Capone's after the awards.

Last year we held the concours on a blistering hot day on the 21st of June. It was perfect concours weather, if you like heat. We had fifty-five cars registered (with quite a few from the JOA-Montreal) and a great day. Following the concours we went to Kelsey's restaurant for dinner.

So there you have it - a thumbnail sketch of the last twelve years. (More photos on page 11)

I might add that in my more than 20 years with the club I am also a Certified Judge and have judged at most Concours events during my time with OJC and previously in the Virginia Jaguar Club. This, along with planning and leading many drives and assisting with events, its time for a break.

Producing our newsletter is not as erroneous as it may seem, and as already noted, it could be divided between Managing Editor and Publisher roles.

The Editors role requires somebody to stay connected within the club, reminding event organizers to provide input on upcoming events, and to have them provide a summary as to how the event went afterwards. Know who in the club has a project on the go and help them to share their story. Basically just keep your ear to the ground, what events of interest are other car clubs having? This is much easier than you think when you are a member of the Board and connected. The time requirement is minimal, a little email time now and then during the month and then a few hours before the end of the month to provide a draft to the Publisher. Pictures are always important.

The Publisher's job is also not difficult to step into if you have some computer skills. Basically, if you are familiar with Microsoft Office and already use Excel and Power Point it is very easy to work with M.S. Publisher, the software that I use. However, you may have your own publishing software that you would rather use, that would be fine. The club is also prepared to purchase any software or tools that you may require to do this job. The same as with the Editors role, you may choose to work on the newsletter a few hours here and there during the month or spend a day at month end, your choice.

You may wish to tackle this position alone or team up with another member to share ideas as noted. Either way there are many benefits to being more involved in your club. You meet and work with a lot of good people and make new friends. You will be more connected within the club and have your say in it's direction. You will get a lot of satisfaction out of your finished product every month, and you will get recognition for it. (I didn't say compensation.) Best of all you may learn a new skill, keep your mind active and have the satisfaction of being a major contributor to the success of your club.

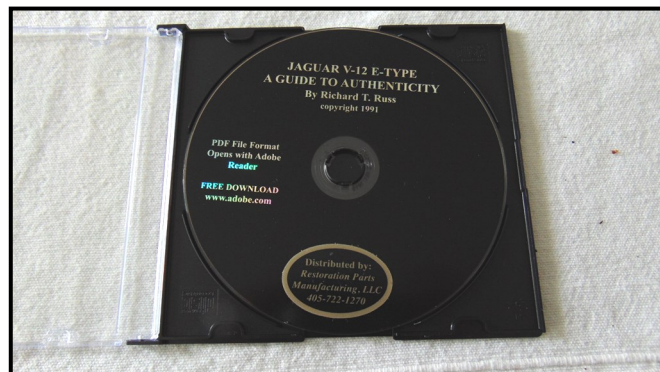

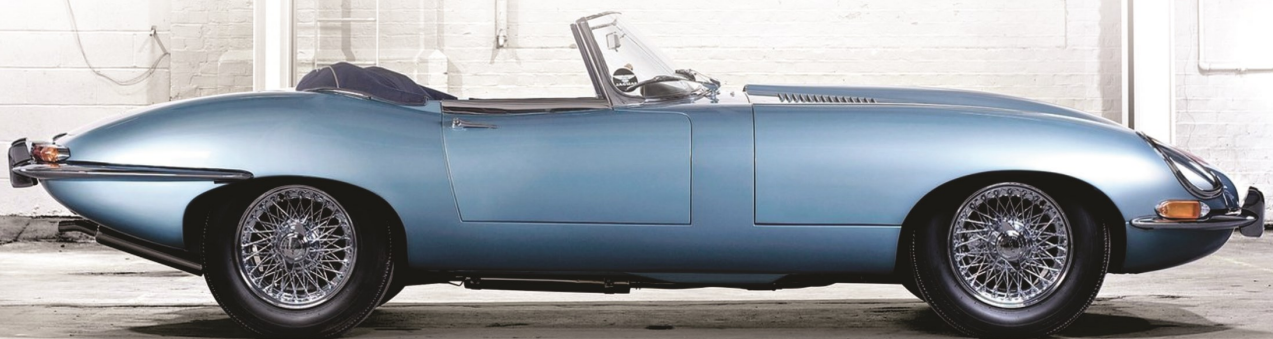
