June Meeting Notes

Guy Larabie, President, opened the meeting at 7:03 PM. He explained that the meeting would focus on co-ordination of the Concours, the Jonat Tour and a presentation by **Phil Karam** on his attendance at the recent Montreal Grand Prix.

The meeting was well attended with 37 present.

Concours D'Elegance

Grant Edwards confirmed that the Concours planning was almost complete. He asked for a decision on the location of the awards presentation; the majority chose an outdoor venue. Chief Judge **Rob Dunlop** confirmed that the judging schedule was in place and that, given the number of judges available, he had dropped one driven class. Grant confirmed 21 cars pre-registered. [Sec Note: a number of members present registered after the meeting.] Near the end of the meeting **Ed Theoret** asked for volunteers at the end of the Concours to dismantle things and clean up. **Jim Walker** complimented Rob Dunlop on the very valuable judges' seminar that was held on the previous Saturday.

Jaguar Owners Tour of North America (The Tour)

Mike O'Brien advised that 13 cars are registered for the tour with people joining in Toronto, Picton, Kingston, Merrickville and Ottawa. Cars, for the most part are mid 80's or newer with one 60's S type and a MK2. The total, including passengers, would be about 20, and it was hoped that all would be at the meet and greet on Friday the 18th. Mike asked that the Club pay for 20 red name-tags with JONAT and Ottawa Sector, plus the leaping cat at a cost, not to exceed \$150.00, for the participants. *The motion was made by Phil Karam and was seconded by Jim Walker, Carried.*

Meet and Greet

Wendy VanderMeulen confirmed that arrangements for the Meet and Greet for the Concours and the Tour were in place. The event is to occur at the Southway Inn at Hunt Club and Bank Street at 7:00 PM Friday June 18th. Dress was determined to be "smart" casual [Sec Note: "no jeans or ball gowns"]. 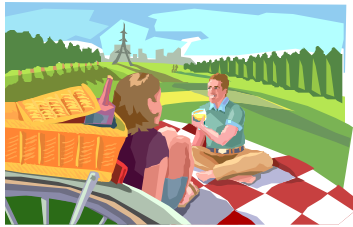

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The Jaguar Owner's North American Tour - 2004

Over a year ago, four Jaguar owners in North America and abroad started to discuss a tour around North America by Jaguar owners. They expended literally thousands of personal hours and their own time to get it organized, created a web site, found individuals to take responsibility for sectors, and fine-tuned the policy. Then it happened.

The Ottawa Sector of this tour was sponsored by the Ottawa Jaguar Club. The key persons involved were organizer **Mike O'Brien** of Ottawa, **Bob Higgs** from Whitby who led the tour from Toronto to Kingston; **Phil Karam** and **Charles "Chuck" Robinson** who got the tour from Kingston to Ottawa, and **Chas James**, a new member who assisted in Ottawa.

The Toronto to Kingston leg on 17 June had its highlights. The members were passed on from the Toronto sector and consisted of **Mike Pawley** from BC and his wife, **Wayne Deswert**, his wife and granddaughter from Westport, New York, and **Victor Krisel** from Toronto. Along the way **Paul Cole** from the Boot 'n Bonnet Club in Kingston dropped in. Bob Higgs, the leader, created a controversial route



for them to follow changing directions several times. Lunch at Isaiah Tubbs resort at Sand Banks Provincial Park in Prince Edward County only took three and a half hours. Finally Bob convinced the travellers that the Adolphustown Ferry cost \$40.00 when in fact it was free. They all had lots to talk about at dinner in Kingston.
