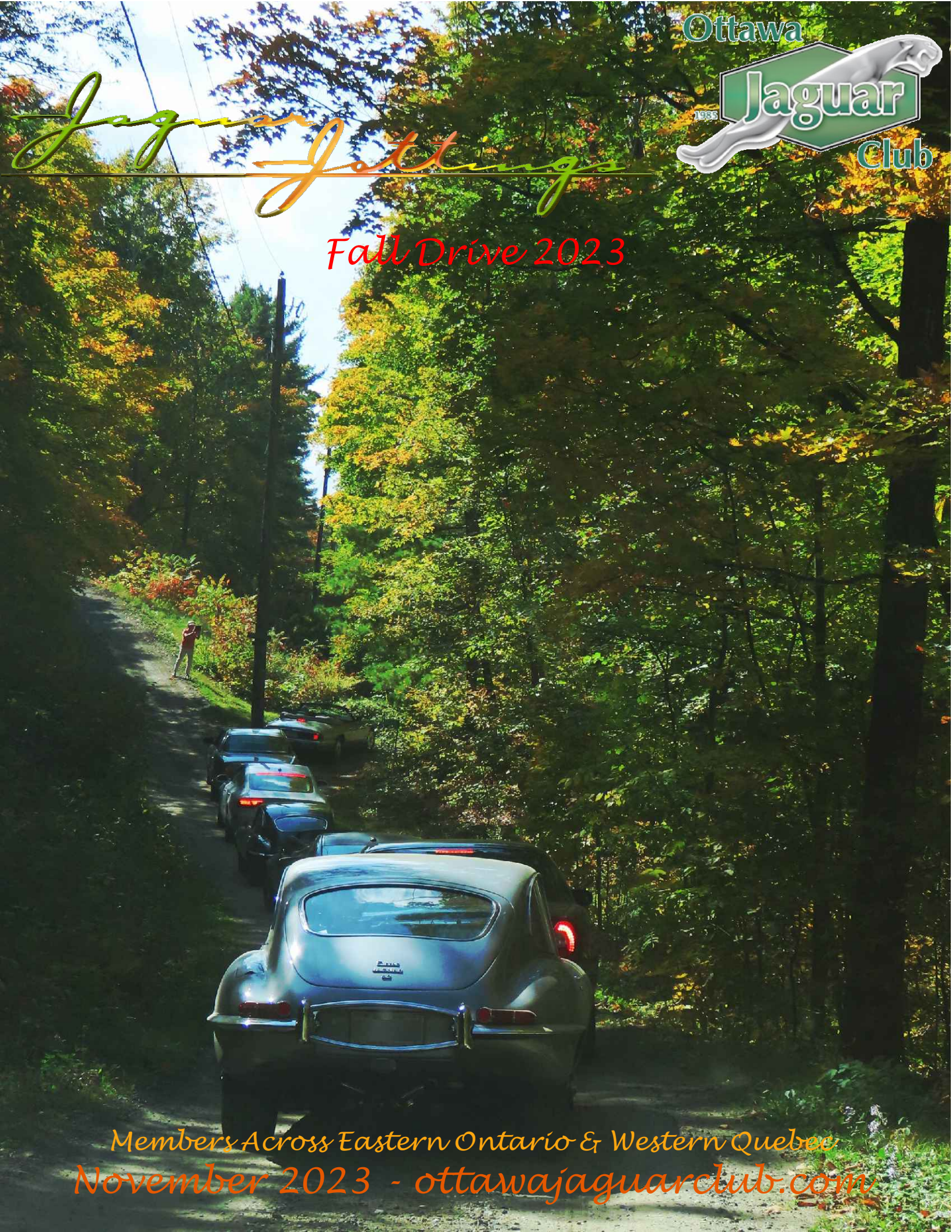

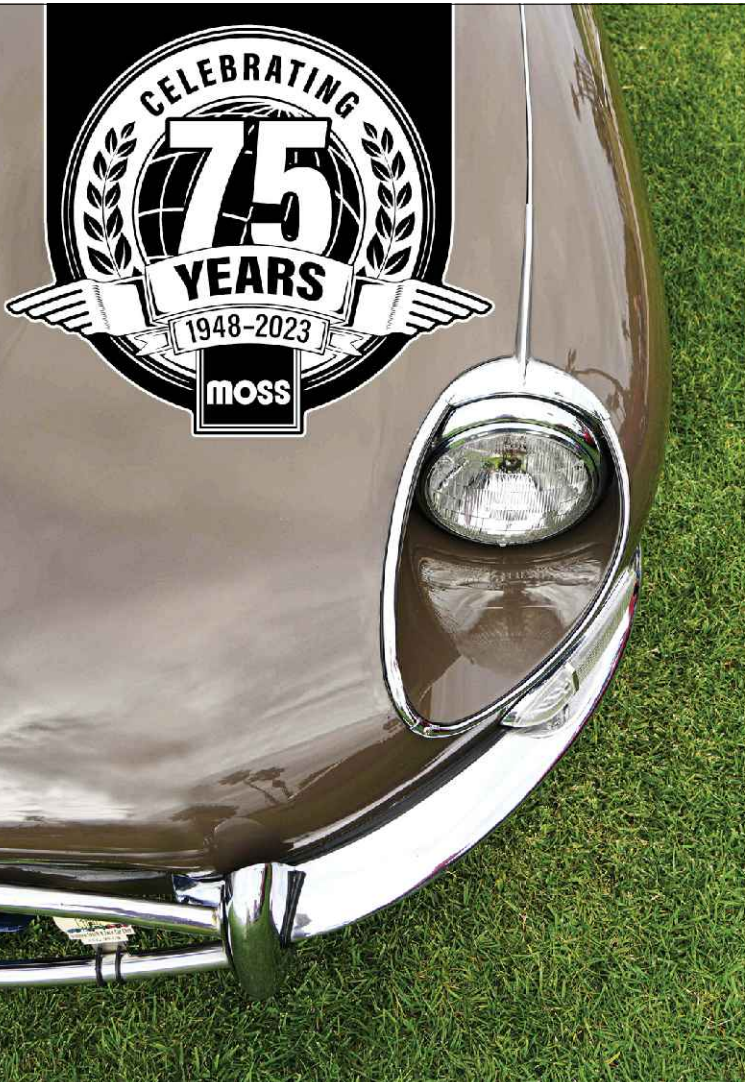
Notice of the OJC Annual General Meeting - November 12th, 2023

2023 OJC Fall Colour Drive **Sept. 30th**

Bonnie and I, having committed to lead the fall drive, decided that an easy route for us to plan and lead would be to the Calabogie area. The



various routes to Calabogie with their hilly, winding and picturesque roads are always a hit with members wishing to exercise their cats. The abundance of fall colours around the Calabogie area would be an added bonus. Given the limited participation that the club has had on the previous three drives, varying from four to seven cars, we decided that, expecting only around six or eight cars maximum to participate, we would make our cottage in the Calabogie area the destination, eliminating the challenge of finding a restaurant for lunch that could handle an unknown number.

We were taken by surprise as the number of participants quickly grew to twelve cars plus us as the lead, a much larger number than we expected to park and entertain at the cottage, especially in the event of inclement weather. The weather however was a bonus for the day. With warm sunny weather forecast all day long, we set out shortly after 10:30am from the parking lot of the Farm Boy Grocery store at Hazeldean and Carp Roads in Stittsville.



Our route took us on a short hop west on Hazeldean Rd. and onto Hwy 7 west towards Carleton Place. We chose this short 15 Km. run on Hwy 7 to get us quickly into the countryside and maintain our target time to arrive in the Calabogie area around Noon.

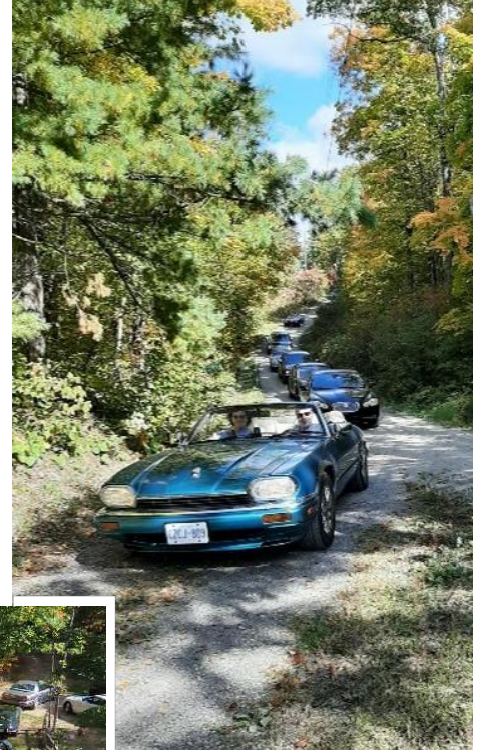
Leaving Hwy 7 we travelled north on the Appleton Side Rd. through mostly farmland to Almonte. After a short tour through picturesque Almonte we turned north onto Hwy 29 through wooded areas, farm land and for a while alongside the Mississippi river to Pakenham. In Pakenham we turned left onto Waba Rd. We followed Waba Rd. through a mix of farmland and wooded areas to and through Waba and onto the White Lake Rd. into the Village of White Lake.



At White Lake we turned onto Burnstown Rd., following it past White Lake (lake) and mostly wooded areas and then onto the Burnstown Bridge, over the Madawaska River, into Burnstown. In Burnstown we turned left onto Calabogie Rd., following it alongside the Madawaska River and mostly wooded areas into Calababogie. Arriving In Calabogie we turned south onto the Lanark Rd., following it through the village and past the bottom end of Calabogie Lake and then 10 Km's south to Bagot Long Lake Rd. Turning onto Bagot Long Lake Rd. the participants were treated to 2 Km's of a winding, hilly cottage road to the Newson's hideaway.

The amazement of it all was the fact that 13 cars in line on a single lane cottage road did not meet another vehicle going the other way!! After getting all of the vehicles parked, snacks were ready and waiting to take the edge off of hungry drivers and navigators. Perfect weather allowed everyone to find a spot either on the deck, the gazebo, or inside the cottage to sit and enjoy lunch.
