BOOK REVIEW

Jaguar XK-140

David Seabright's summary inspired by the book "Jaguar Sports Cars" by Paul Skilleter

The Dawn (1954-1955)

In the autumn of 1954, under the bright lights of the London Motor Show, Jaguar unveiled the XK-140--the successor to the legendary XK-120. The world had already fallen in love with XK-120's the speed and elegance. but the XK-140 promised refinement. Its engine pushed forward three was inches, giving drivers more cockpit space. Rack-and-pinion steering, stronger bumpers, and



improved suspension made it not just faster, but more civilized. On its boot lid, a proud badge proclaimed Jaguar's Le Mans victories from 1951-1953, a reminder that this was no ordinary sports car--it was born from racing glory. This was the XK-140's youth: bold, confident, and eager to prove itself.

The Golden Years (1955-1956)

By the mid-1950s, Jaguar had recognized that its strongest market was across the Atlantic. North American buyers wanted sturdier bumpers and prominent overriders, and the reflected XK-140 those demands. Compared with the XK-120, the new car was three inches longer, with the firewall and cowl moved forward to create more cabin space. Jaguar's factory was running at full tilt, with every hand busy turning out refreshed models.



XK-140 at a Glance

Built for America:

Jaguar tailored the XK-140 to its strongest market, adding sturdier bumpers, overriders, and more cabin space by moving the engine and firewall forward.

Expanded Range:

Offered as Roadster (OTS), Fixed Head Coupé (FHC), and Drophead Coupé (DHC), with optional 2+2 seating and the high-performance SE package.

Performance:

Up to 210 hp from the 3.4-litre straight-six, dual exhaust, and revised valves. Capable of 140 mph depending on gearing. Touring fuel economy around 15 mpg.

Options:

Alloy wheels standard, wire wheels a popular upgrade.

Curious Omission:

Jaguar never published official instrumented performance figures, leaving enthusiasts to rely on magazine impressions.

Design Quirk:

The heavy front bumper was mounted directly to the chassis rather than fully integrated into the bodywork.

Legacy:

A natural evolution of the XK line, blending racing pedigree with touring refinement, and bridging the raw XK-120 with the polished XK-150.

Jaguar XK-140 (concluded)

The XK-140 range expanded into multiple body styles: the open two-seater Roadster (OTS), the Fixed Head Coupé (FHC), and the Drophead Coupé (DHC). Buyers could also choose a 2+2 configuration and opt for the Special Equipment (SE) package, which brought a higher-output version of the 3.4-litre straight-six--up to 210 horsepower with dual exhaust and revised valves. Top speeds of 140 mph were possible depending on gearing, though fuel consumption was heavy: around 10 mpg in racing conditions and 15 mpg when touring. Alloy wheels were standard, with wire wheels a popular option. For the first time, buyers could even choose an automatic transmission, broadening its appeal.

This was the XK-140 at its most versatile: a car equally at home on a racetrack, a country lane, or parked outside a grand hotel. It embodied the glamour of mid-1950s motoring--fast, stylish, and unmistakably British.

The Legacy (1956-1957 and beyond)

By 1957, the XK-140's time in the spotlight was drawing to a close. Its successor, the XK-150, was waiting in the wings with modern lines more and refinements. Yet the XK-140 had already secured its place in history. It had bridged the gap between the raw, pioneering XK-120 and the more polished XK-150, offering a balance of performance, comfort, and style that made beloved it bv enthusiasts.

1955 Jaguar XK-140 Fixed Head Coupe

This car was fitted with custom exhaust headers as well as an oil cooler, as well as disk brakes, which makes me wonder if it was used by Duncan Hamilton as a race car ???



HISTORICAL SUMMARY

I am delighted to have found and purchased a 1955 XK140 FHC rhd that was originally owned by the late William Heynes, the chief design engineer at Jaguar Motor Cars. Bill Heynes joined Sir William Lyons at SS Cars (Jaguar) in 1935. Bill was the main protagonist for the XK engine. He immediately saw a twin-overhead camshaft as the means to achieve 100mph, by dispending with pushrods, thus allowing higher RPM, and complementing a hemispherical combustion chamber. This engine survived 4 decades to become one of the great engines of all time.

This XK140 was built in 05/05/55 (May 5th, 1955) and first dispatched (registered) to Bill Heynes May 14th, 1955. His assigned plate was "RHP 444", with 'R' being issued between April and June of 1955, and 'HP' designating registration in Coventry.


After locating Bills' son Jonathan, and speaking with him, his first reaction was "Is it 'RHP 444'? , I can never forget the number, we have such fond memories of that XK140" (45 years later). Jonathan went on to tell me that his mother (a petite 5'1") would drive the car at 100mph!



Three years later, Bill Heynes sold the XK140 to Duncan Hamilton. For a decade from 1947-1957, Duncan Hamilton was one of Britain's foremost racing driver. Duncan drove Formula One and two Grand Prix cars from Lago-Talbot, Maserati, HWM Jaguar and Gordini, plus Works Team Sports Cars for both Jaguar and Ferrari. He won two legendary enduring races – The 1953 LeMans 24 hours in a Jaguar "C" type and the 1954 Reims 12 hour in a "D" type.

The car was purchased from Duncan Hamilton by a Canadian military man and brought to Ottawa, Canada. After 3 other owners, I acquired the XK140 FHC rhd. I intend to fully restore this very special classic and offer it for sale, hopefully back in England, where it rightfully belongs.

STORING YOUR JAGUAR "INSIDE and OUT"

The following is a list of things to do while putting your Jaguar (or other) car in storage, as well as removing it from its 6 month winter hibernation.

PREPARING YOUR CAR FOR WINTER STORAGE

- TIRES: Pressure up to 45lbs on 4 road tires and 30 lbs for spare. 1)
- 2) OIL/FILTER: Preferred time to change, so that the impurities do not sit all winter.
- 3) GASOLINE: Add fuel stabilizer to fuel tank. Some recommend topping-up fuel tank in order to minimize condensation.
- FOGGING: Using spray fogging oil into the carburetors in order to lubricate the valves/head/pistons, 4) or remove the plugs and spray directly into each cylinder. Turn the engine over. Clean and set the gaps of the plugs or install new ones. Using the same fogging oil, do your door hinges, door latch and striker, hood hinges, hood release and latch, trunk hinges and latch, jack, etc...
- 5) BATTERY: Preferably remove the battery from the car and store in a warmer setting. Check the acid level and top up if necessary with distilled water. The voltage should be 12.5 volts. If not, charge or trickle charge until 12.5 volts is obtained. Check and recharge every month or two if necessary.
- 6) BRAKE FLUID: Flush out reservoir using a turkey baster to agitate and suck out old fluid. Replace with the grade of fluid as specified for. Do not use Dot 4 or synthetic if DOT 3 is called up. The chemicals added to DOT 4 will derogate the older style rubber compound as in brake hoses, master cylinders, wheel cylinders. Same goes for clutch fluid.
- 7) ANTIFREEZE: Measure voltage between fluid and ground. Less than .5 volts is good. Anything above 1.5 volts should be changed immediately in order to prevent corrosion of the aluminum head and fittings. Check freezing point level and top up if necessary.
- INTERIOR: If stored in a outside garage, place a few sheets of "Bounce" or "Fleecy" to ward off mice. 8) The same or moth balls into the engine compartment to ward off squirrels and chipmunks.


