JAGUAR'S FORGOTTEN VICTORY

Post WWII Britain's rebuild with its gradual return to normal peacetime life, included the reemergence and demand for the auto industry. Jaguar Cars appeared out of the pre-war SS Car Company with a new six-cylinder twin overhead cam engine to power its advanced design luxurious sporting saloons and sports cars. A key element to ensure the success of the small company was the publicity created through competing in auto races, rallies and speed events. This approach proved highly successful in bringing the fledging auto manufacturer worldwide attention in the early '50s, with an unprecedented string of five wins in the Le Mans 24 Hour Race ('51, '53, '55, '56 and '57).

Another win in June 1954 however went virtually unnoticed, particularly curious as it occurred in the largest market for Jaguar (and other foreign makes) ...the United States. Sports car racing had become popular in the US and numerous private Jag owners competed with XK, C and D-Types but it was in America's homegrown NASCAR stockcar series that the unlikely event took place.

By 1954, NASCAR's founder Bill France was looking to add new territories to the already-expansive Grand National Series by extending the reach to include a road race for the first time. Over 50 laps, the "International 100 Mile Race" would be run over a makeshift track at the Linden, New Jersey airport. (continued next page)

JAGUAR'S FORGOTTEN VICTORY

On the day, 21 of the 43 car field were non-American cars (13 Jaguars, 5 MGs, one Austin Healey, one Morgan and one Porsche). This was not in fact the first time foreign cars had participated in a NASCAR race (June 1953 won in a Hudson). For the race, an Oldsmobile and a Hudson qualified ahead of the first Jaguar in third. Al Keller, a journeyman NASCAR driver qualified seventh in a Jaguar owned by renowned big band leader Paul Whiteman. The first two cars led for the first half of the race before Keller took the lead in his Jaguar for the final 28 laps and the victory, a half mile ahead of the second place Hudson. Jaguars also finished in fourth, fifth and sixth positions.

NASCAR decided that road courses with "foreign" cars were not in their best interests, although road courses were later added to their schedule. There was another NASCAR race with non-US cars in 1958 at Riverside California, with a mixed bag including two Citroens (18th and 19th), a Renault and a Goliath (...look it up...) (27th). No other "foreign" cars appeared again in NASCAR races until 2007 when Toyota joined to race in the series. Jaguar shares the distinction of being a one time NASCAR winner with Nash.

The Jaguar NASCAR victory in 1954 doesn't commonly show up in Jaguar racing records but it was the last victory by a foreign make for more than 50 years until the arrival of Toyota.

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



For general interest I was able to obtain this stainless steel based assembly from an American aftermarket source (BELL) through SNG Barratt in Londonderry, NH, USA within 2 1/2 weeks for less than 1/2 the price of an original British assembly in mild steel.

Leather Restoration Technics by Phil Karam

After the tour and a cup of coffee and a donut Phil commenced to regale us with the process that he has developed to restore older Jaguar leather. He used a seat cover from an old S Type provided by Rob Laughton the local representative for leatherique products.



This photo shows Phil discussing the need to remove the dye from the upper surface of the leather to allow re-oiling of the leather to return the suppleness.



In this photo Phil explains the need to clear away the old dye using, in his process, gunwash or a varsol/lacquer thinner solution that is then lightly sanded. This is preceded by a careful removal of any loose dirt on the seat with compressed air.



Once the seat has been cleaned and the dye removed then a number of liberal coatings of leatherique rejuvenating oil is applied to soften the leather. 5 Coats a few days apart is optimum. Leatherique recommends that when using their product the use of Pristine Clean preceed the use of the rejuvenating oil to remove embedded dirt and previous layers of dye. These leatherique products are water based.



This photo shows the S type seat where at the top of the photo the leater is hard and original. The next horizontal layer shows the dye removed by Phil's process (medium brown). The next layer toward the bottom shows what the seat looks like with the rejuvenating oil applied (darker brown). The bottom three strips (near phils gloved hand) shows the leather with all the treatments above that has been dyed using a small brush (2 coats of water based dye).

The following list is Phil's guidelines for restoration:

- Air Blow the cracks and seams
- Remove the old dye with lacquer thinner/gun wash
- Sand with #400 grit paper if nescessary
- Apply rejuvenator oil-let sit 48 hours (if extra dry you may need more applications)
- Remove the surface oil with Pristine Clean
- Apply filler in all the cracks (available from leatherique)
- Sand with #600 sandpaper and damp clean with Leatherique cleaning agent
- Apply the first coat of dye with a rag or a brush
- Apply the second coat of dye with a brush
- Buff (by hand)
- Where the seat will come in contact with another such as the rear part of the seat cushion where it goes under the back seat rest apply pledge furniture polish to prevent sticking

Equipment Needed:

Safety Glasses; Rags; Very course and Medium Course scouring pads; hand sander; water bottle, a pan for the thinner solution; thinner/gunwash; rejuvenator oil; large paint brush; fingernail scrub brush; air hose; rubber gloves; pristine clean; prepping agent, acrylic brush for dye (artists brush); dye (if you need to match the colour exactly cut a small piece about 1 inch square from under the seat where it has not faded and send it to the dye provider); small cups



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
1968 Series 1.5 E Type Jaguar Convertible
