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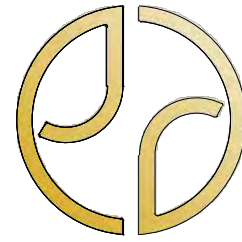

FORZA JAGUAR!

Ottawa's popular annual Italian festival with a showcase of Italian vehicles, occurred this past weekend. At the invitation of the car show host Ferrari Club, Jaguars and Corvettes took part in the Concorso d'Eleganza for the first time. On Friday, under a gloomy and unpredictable sky, nine Jaguars parked alongside a like number of Corvettes in amongst a wide variety of Italian motoring delicacies from Ferrari, Maserati, Lamborghini and Alfa Romeo. In delightful contrast to the exotic machinery, a selection of humble Vespas and Lambrettas ably represented the opposite end of the Italian mobility scale.

As our first venture at this event, the club selected a chronological cross section of nine club cars from Jim Butcher's much admired 1957 Jaguar 3.4 saloon to Wit Lewandowski's limited series 2021 F-Type. In between, two E-types, an XJS, two XK8/R and two XK/Rs covered the time frame through the development of Jaguars sports cars.

The morning stayed dry long enough for our group to get out and about to admire the dizzying array of machinery as well as answer questions from visitors walking by and inspecting our Jags. The benefit of coffee and donuts on arrival was short lived and by lunchtime, members drifted off to nearby Mexicali Rosa's and Pub Italia for a sustenance top up. The afternoon unfortunately brought periodic showers and before long, cars started to depart for home after a gratifying if at times challenging day.

The concorso chairman was very pleased with the OJC showing and indicated that Jaguars were now considered a permanent fixture of this event. For their part, the Ferrari club hosted an excellent event in a gorgeous, picturesque location along Queen Elizabeth Drive. A return in 2027 is definitely in the cards and all the more appealing with the likely return of the festival's traditional summer sunshine.

Finally, many thanks to the intrepid club members who ignored the doom and gloom forecast to brave the uncertain weather and give us a 100% turnout.

Classic Car Show at Venvi Lynwood Park

In May, Venvi Lynwood Park announced they would be having a classic car show on Saturday June 20, 2026. The weather in early June was chilly and wet, and the forecast was leaning towards a cancellation. As it happens, the weather broke on Friday night and Saturday started a bit cloudy but became sunnier as the day went on.

Because it was a nice day, there was a big turnout of classic car fans from the neighbourhood and the seniors center. The car fans were treated to live music by a group that was playing hits from the 1970s and there was a barbecue which was free for car exhibitors and residents, and available for purchase by other visitors.

A number of members of the Antique Automobile Club of America, Ottawa Capital Region, were present, although several members decided not to attend due to the questionable weather.

Most of the cars were American muscle cars from the '60s, '70s, and '80s. A few vehicles had been modified, a few had the original patina, but most were in original but restored condition.

Several years ago, I was a member of the Ottawa Jaguar Club, beginning shortly after we purchased a 1986 Jaguar Vanden Plas from the former Jaguar dealer on Merivale Road. I have not been a member for several years but have corresponded with Mike O'Brien and Phil Karam regarding various issues since that time. It is a beautiful car and, with bits and pieces being replaced, as needed. However, I have not driven it much in the last year and my mechanic told me last fall that the two gas tanks need replacing due to a build-up of sediment that he cannot remove. Nonetheless, he was able to drive it and put it in our garage for the winter.



1986 Jaguar XJ2 Vanden Plas - Beautiful, Well-Maintained Classic Car (VIN: SAJBN1047GC4470) Based on the VIN **SAJBN1047GC4470**, your vehicle is a **1986 Jaguar XJ12** Series III, equipped with the iconic **5.3L V12 engine**. It was manufactured at the historic **Browns Lane** plant in Coventry, England.

Excellent body, leather, engine and mechanics. Purchased from the Ottawa Jaguar dealer in June of 1992, this sedan has been continuously cared for in terms of its exterior, interior, and under-the-hood. Mileage is 124,100 km. It has never seen a winter and has been kept in the garage when not in use. Its finish is a glossy grey/Wedgewood blue, with a grey leather interior and a burled walnut console. Original jaguar spoked wheels. It has an automatic transmission, sunroof and all-season Pirelli tires. Car is equipped with a lifetime anti-rust electronic device (\$1,100 in 2006). It was appraised for insurance in November 2007 at CAD \$40,000. Additional photos, repair and maintenance records are available upon request, as is the original manual. In the past year, it has not been driven frequently enough and as a consequence, it is in need of two new stainless steel gas tanks because of deposit build-up in the current tanks. I have sourced these from Moss Motors, and can provide the order information and cost details upon request. It is a very beloved car, but as it is not likely that I will be able to drive it as often as it should be, I am hoping to find someone who will care for it just as it has been. Price is negotiable. 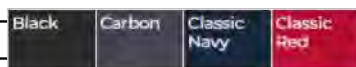
