Be there at: Tim Horton's, 09:00 am

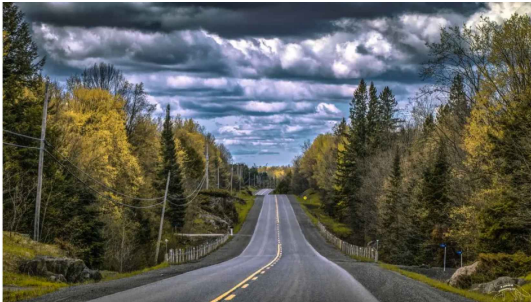
Departure: 9:30 am sharp

For the fourth and final adventure of the OJC driving season, we will be heading off west into the hills and maybe even see some early fall colours. Unlike the previous three drives, we are not following any river, but we will pass by the Madawaska River, and Mississippi Lake for a longer stretch.

The main point of this drive is to run through some hilly terrain, first around Carp, then by the Madawaska River and Calabogie, and finally along the Route 511 down to Lanark. The last part of the drive is along Drummond Concession 7 and Tennyson Rd, which are two exceptionally good cruising roads, thanks to the team at the Lanark County Roads dept. A very nice way to finish off this drive, and the 2026 Drive Schedule.

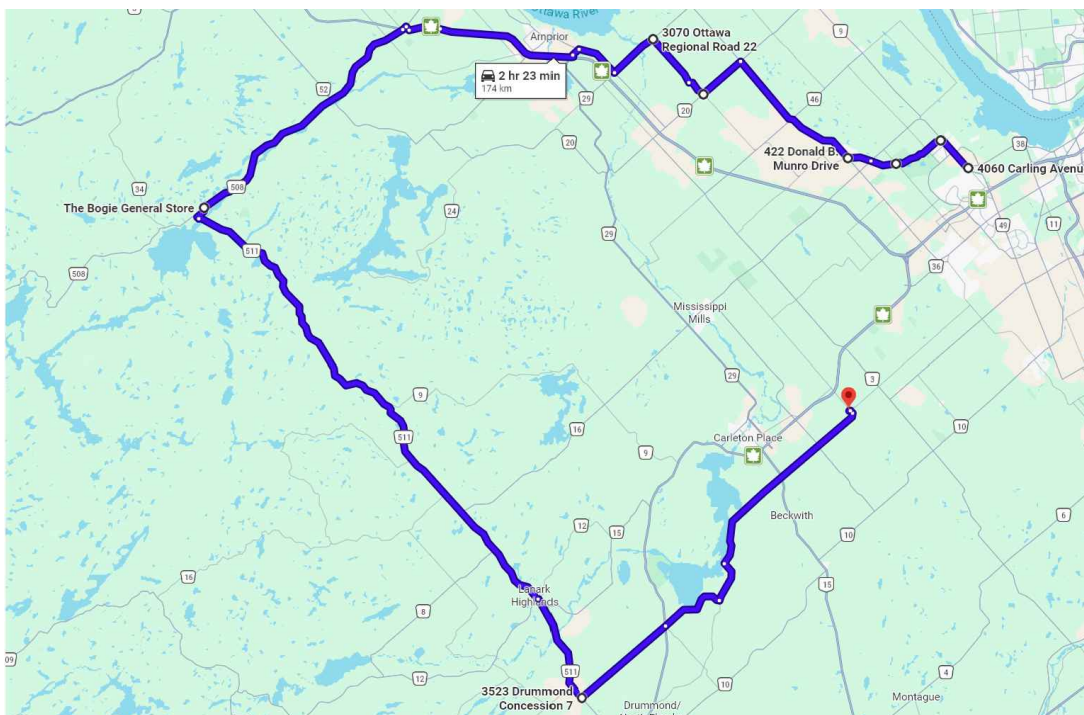

However, I have not driven it much in the last year and my mechanic told me last fall that the two gas tanks need replacing due to a build-up of sediment that he cannot remove. Nonetheless, he was able to drive it and put it in our garage for the winter.
